
CRITERIA FOR JUNIOR COACHING LEVEL 3 TENCH

In order to pass Tench Level Three, Participants will be required to do the following.

- 1. Landing your own fish can be tricky when you first start fishing. This tutorial will show you the benefits of a long light handle with a lightweight net, and how to use them.
- 2. Shop bought ready tied hooks make fishing so much easier. There are so many, which ones do you choose? This tutorial will show you how.
- 3. This section will show you how to set up a rod and reel for use with a Waggler float.
- 4. A catapult is not a toy. This section will show Juniors how to use one safely and responsibly.
- 5. Following a tutorial that will show how to set out your fishing tackle so you can be more organised and fish more efficiently.
- 6. To pass this section juniors will need to learn the internal parts of a fish. Diagrams can be found you the booklet and on the website online booklets.
- 7. Good watercraft is vital to any kind of fishing. Identifying potential fish holding spots or signs of feeding fish can really make or break a fishing session. This tutorial will show you how.
- 8. KHV can ruin a fishery. Anglers have a responsibility to prevent the spread of the virus. Juniors will learn how they can help.
