In order to pass Bream Level four, Participants will be required to do the following.

- 1. Introduction to the special equipment needed to operate a pole and why fishing with a pole can enormously effective in experienced hands.
- 2. This tutorial will teach Juniors how to choose the right pole rigs for different situations and conditions, and how to make the rigs that you select catch more fish.
- 3. Learning how to feed with a pole will teach Juniors how to handle a pole properly and improve their pole fishing skills.
- 4. As poles get longer they get more difficult to use. Being able to handle a pole at 5 metres with or without a spray bar will cover many fishing situations in modern fishing.
- 5. An introduction to the many methods and techniques used in modern Carp fishing. From boilies to bivvies, this is where it all starts.
- 6. This tutorial will help Juniors choose the right rod and reel to begin Carp fishing, as well as all the other bits and pieces required to begin your Carp fishing journey.
- 7. Big fish need big nets. This tutorial will show Juniors how to use the large 42 inch landing nets required by most specimen fisheries.
- 8. This tutorial will teach Juniors what components needed to tie a basic Carp rig and how to assemble them.
